### SPECIAL CAMP NEEDS TOP HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

MISSOULA--

Twenty Montana high school juniors will get a taste of collegiate studies this summer at the Conservation Orientation Camp.

The June 9-15 camp at the Goat Creek Station near Swan Lake will be based on actual experience and problem analysis, rather than the traditional lecture-discussion procedures.

The camp is sponsored by the Montana State Forester and the University of Montana School of Forestry.

It is designed to give first hand career information and educational background on natural resource conservation and management to the student who has finished his junior year of high school.

Robert W. Lange, associate professor of forestry, and Don Drummond, deputy state forester, Missoula, are co-directors of the camp. The course will involve eight members of the School of Forestry faculty.

The evening programs will involve presentations by governmental agencies and companies to explain their views and approaches toward resource conservation and management.

Applications should be sent to Lange, School of Forestry, University of Montana, Missoula, by April 20.
