STUDENTS FOR MCCARTHY SPONSOR VOTER REGISTRATION

MISSOULA---

More than 350 people registered to vote Wednesday and Thursday at the University of Montana in a drive sponsored by Students for McCarthy, a UM organization supporting Eugene McCarthy as presidential candidate. John Goers and Fred Bodholt, both of Missoula, were chairman and cochairman, respectively, of the project.

Both UM students and off-campus potential voters registered in the drive, which handled by 12 members of the Students for McCarthy organization.

One purpose of the drive, according to a member of the group, was to inform out-of-state people on the UM campus unaware of their voting eligibility that they may vote in Montana if they meet the state qualifications. They must be U.S. citizens, 21 years of age on or before June 4, must have resided in Montana for one year prior to June 4 and must not be registered elsewhere.

Another purpose of the drive, according to the student, is to "push for Eugene McCarthy."
