AT PANEL ON UM CAMPUS

First in a series of panels on the sociology of the classroom will be held from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. Saturday, April 13, in Territorial Rooms 2 and 3 of the Lodge at the University of Montana.

Dr. Robert Bierstedt of the sociology department at New York University will be the featured panel member.
