The Department of Speech Communication at the University of Montana will present a series of motion picture documentaries on "Education and Technology" May 18 on the Missoula campus.

The public is invited to the series, which will be held in the UM Music Recital Hall from 9 a.m.-4 p.m.

The films, dealing with communication and the new media in education, feature such professionals in the field of communication as Marshall McLuhan, author of "Understanding Media."

The seven short films include "The Information Explosion," "The Process of Communication," "Perception and Communication," "Teaching Machines and Sidney Pressey," "Music Research," "The Communications Revolution" and "The Teacher and Technology."

A panel discussion between members of the UM and MSU faculty will follow the films.
