HAMILTON'S CRAIG STOENNER TO ATTEND
UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA FOR FOOTBALL

MISSOULA---

Craig Stoenner, 6-1, 170-pound halfback from Hamilton High School, will attend the University of Montana on a football scholarship this fall, Jack Swarthout, head football coach and athletic director, announced Tuesday.

Stoenner, an All-League player for the Broncs last fall, is also an outstanding performer in track and field for Hamilton High. He was high-point individual at last Saturday's Hamilton Rotational Meet, and also at the Montana State Indoor Meet in Bozeman earlier this spring.

"Craig signed a letter of intent to attend the University," Swarthout said, "and we're extremely happy that he will join our freshman program this fall."

Swarthout said he was highly impressed with Stoenner's quickness and cutting ability. The star athlete ran four kickoffs back for touchdowns last fall, and had several all-the-way returns called back by penalties, a good indication of his running ability.
