OHIO GRID STAR TO ENROLL AT MONTANA ON FROSH FOOTBALL SCHOLARSHIP

MISSOULA---

Allan Dooley, a 5-11, 195-pound linebacker in high school at Ottawa, Ill., will attend the University of Montana on a football scholarship this fall, Ron Nord, UM grid assistant, announced Wednesday.

Dooley was selected as "Most Valuable Player" by his teammates after last season's play had brought the school's football winning string to 27 straight games. He was co-captain of the team last fall and was an All-Conference selection. He also was given All-State special mention in Illinois, and was named to the All-Area team encompassing several high school leagues.

"The staff has watched Al play on film and we consider him a very fine prospect," Nord said.

Dooley will major in Wildlife Biology at the University. Nord said this was a key factor in his selection of the Missoula school.
