GERALD MOORE PRESENTS  
LECTURE-RECITAL APRIL 29

MISSOULA---

Gerald Moore, noted English accompanist, will present a lecture and piano recital at 8:15 p.m. April 29 in the University Theater at the University of Montana.

Moore, who gained most of his early training in Canada, began his fame with a tour through the United States in 1925, and has accompanied numerous internationally known soloists since then. He was awarded the Cobbett Gold Medal in 1951 for chamber music and was made a Commander of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth II in 1954 for his contribution to music.

He is the author of three books, "Singer and Accompanist," "Am I Too Loud" and "The Unashamed Accompanist," which is also the title of a record of his lecture-musical talent. He has made six recital-lecture tours in the U.S.

An admission charge of \$1 for students and \$1.50 for general admission will be charged. Moore's visit is sponsored by Program Council of the Associated Students at UM.
