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BADM 341 - Systems and Operations Spring 2003

Required Text: *Operations Management Strategy and Analysis 6th Edition*, by Lee J. Krajewski and Larry P. Ritzman

Course Description: The aim of this course is to integrate the conceptual fields of systems analysis and operations management for the purpose of providing students with a sophisticated view of the interrelationship between the various functional areas of the firm and technology. During the term we will examine the application of various technologies and quantitative models to specific business problems as well as the challenges associated with aligning technology with business strategy.
