### MILLER ORGAN RECITAL IS TUESDAY ON CAMPUS

Ramsey K. Miller, an applied music major at the University of Montana, will present his senior organ recital Tuesday (May 7) at 8:15 p.m. in the Recital Hall.

The free, public program consists of J. S. Bach's Prelude in G Major and Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor; Franz Liszt's Prelude and Fugue on B.A.C.H., and Dupre's Versets pour les Vepres du Commun des Fetes de la Sainte Vierge; Antiphon II - I am black but comely, O ye daughters of Jerusalem; Antiphon V - How fair and how pleasant art Thou, and Prelude and Fugue in G minor, op. 7, III.

Miller studies organ with Prof. Laurence Perry. His recital Tuesday partially fulfills requirements for the bachelor of music degree in applied music.

Miller is a carillonneur at the University, and he is organist at St. Anthony Church. Following graduation he plans to spend a few years learning the organ-building craft before beginning work on a master's degree.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick K. Miller of Billings, are spending this academic year in Eugene, Ore., where Mr. Miller is doing graduate work at the University of Oregon.
