BOZEMAN PIANIST TO GIVE CAMPUS RECITAL

The rarely heard Beethoven Sonata in A Major, Op. 101, will be performed in the University of Montana Recital Hall Wednesday (May 8) by Dr. Wayne McEvelly of Bozeman. The free program will begin at 8:15 p.m.

Dr. McEvelly, Montana State University pianist and philosophy professor, will also perform Chaconne and Variations in G Major by Handel, Sonata in D Major, Op. 28, by Beethoven, Four Impromptus, Op. 30, by Schubert, and Trois Gnossiennes (1890) by Satie.

The recitalist received a Ph.D. in philosophy at the University of Southern California in 1963. His doctoral dissertation dealt with musical aesthetics.

His training includes attendance at the Philadelphia Conservatory of Music and the University of Pennsylvania, private study in New York with Nadia Reisenberg, and graduate study at USC with John Crown and Alice Ehlers. He currently studies piano with Charles Payne of the MSU Music Department.

He has given recitals at the Philadelphia Conservatory, the Philadelphia Art Alliance, Carnegie Recital Hall, and the Universities of Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, New Mexico, Guadalajara, and Southern California.
