UM, STATE LEGISLATIVE
COUNCIL SPONSOR
STUDENT INTERN PROGRAM

MISSOULA---

Four or more University of Montana students will receive some first-hand experience in state legislative procedures during the 1969 State Legislature.

At least four UM students will be selected to participate in the Legislative Intern Program, a program sponsored jointly by the UM Department of Political Science and the State Legislative Council.

Two members of the UM political science department--Dr. Ellis Waldron, professor, and Dr. Douglas C. Chaffey, assistant professor--met in Helena recently with a subcommittee of the State Legislative Council to work out the interns' prospective duties and to determine commitments of state legislators to the program.

Dr. Waldron said the council will assign UM student interns to various experienced legislators about Dec. 1, so that the students "get the broadest possible exposure to legislative affairs."

Each internship will carry a stipend of \$600 in funds provided by the UM Foundation. Applications for the program may be submitted through Saturday (May 25). They may be sent or delivered to UM political science department.
