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SCHWANK ONE OF ELEVEN NAMED TO IOWA GRID COACHES HALL OF FAME

MISSOULA---

Dr. Walter Schwank, chairman of the University of Montana health, physical education and recreation department, received word late last week of his induction into the Iowa Football Coaches Hall of Fame.

The former UM athletic director was one of 11 men named to the group, started last year, bringing the total membership to 21.

The Seneca, Ill. native attended Davenport, Iowa High School, graduating in 1930. He played football there under Coach Jesse Day, also one of the 11 new members of the Hall of Fame.

Schwank coached at Sibley, Iowa (1934-38), Anamosa, Iowa (1938-41), Carroll, Iowa (1941-43), Iowa City, Iowa (1943-46) and Davenport (1946-50) in the high school ranks, then was assistant coach at Iowa University from 1951 to 1955. He was head grid coach at Coe College in Iowa from 1956 to 1960.

Schwank's lifetime coaching record is 117 wins, 52 losses and 8 ties. He had five undefeated seasons during his coaching career, including three straight at Anamosa High School.
