MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Thirty-seven Music School Foundation scholarships will be renewed or awarded for the 1968 fall quarter at the University of Montana, Dean Charles W. Bolen of the School of Fine Arts announced.

Recipients are selected by the UM music faculty on the basis of performing ability and scholarship, the dean said. He explained that Music School Foundation scholarships provide most of the aid available to students, but some music scholarships come from the UM Foundation and from fee waivers.

Full-fee scholarships of \$500 each will be renewed for the Young Artists String Quartet. Members of the quartet during the current academic year are Heidi Syroid and Kristin Forssen, both of Missoula; Frederick Inman, Billings, and Ilona Peckham, Belt. A \$500 scholarship in piano will go to Frederika Ibsen, Missoula.

Sources of these full scholarships are the Wayne Montgomery Sr. Memorial Fund, donated by Wayne Montgomery Jr., Lima; the Julia Neil Schoknecht Memorial Fund, donated by Dorothy Schoknecht, Kalispell, and Mark Schoknecht, Libby; Mrs. Frederic Rohmer, New York, N. Y., and the Women's Committee of the Missoula Civic Symphony Association.

Five \$400 woodwind quintet scholarships will again be given. The quintet this year was comprised of Becky Brugger, John Hancock and Susan Rovero, all of Great Falls; Linda Vogel, Bozeman, and Carmen DeSilva, Plentywood. Erika Syroid, Missoula, an entering freshman, will receive a \$400 award. A \$250 voice scholarship, held this year by Melodee Lyman, will be given again.
