AWARDED FULBRIGHT

MISSOULA---

Margaret J. Cummings, Great Falls, a June graduate of the University of Montana, Missoula, has received a Fulbright Scholarship and travel grant to study at the University of Bonn, Germany.

Miss Cummings, who recently received her bachelor's degree, with honors, in German at UM, won the grant to study German and German literature at Bonn. She hopes also to study political science.

The grant is for 10 months. Miss Cummings leaves from New York September 6 and plans to return August 1969.

Many opportunities for independent travel are afforded by the program, Miss Cummings said. She plans to live in a dormitory in Bonn during her months of study and to visit as much of Europe as possible during the University semester breaks.

A committee of faculty and administrators on the Missoula campus, under the direction of <sup>Dr.</sup>Merrel D. Clubb, Jr., UM professor of English, interviewed and recommended Miss Cummings. She was then considered by a bi-national American and German committee and was accepted.

Miss Cummings is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Cummings, 2316 7th Ave. So., Great Falls. Miss Cummings was graduated from Great Falls Public High School, which she represented as an American Field Service exchange student to Germany in 1963.
