G.F. ATTORNEY
TO PARTICIPATE
IN LAWYERS' ESTATE
SHORT COURSE AT UM

MISSOULA--

An attorney from Great Falls is among several lawyers, including two from other states, who will participate in a lawyers' short course on estate planning July 22-27 at the University of Montana, Missoula.

Dale Forbes, a law partner with Church, Harris, Johnson & Williams, Great Falls, will discuss post-death estate planning during the six-day seminar, which is being held under the program entitled Continuing Legal Education--Montana (CLEM) at UM.

Forbes, who received three degrees--Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws, all with honors, from UM, has spoken several times at tax institutes conducted annually by the UM School of Law. The upcoming program is sponsored by the law school and the Montana Bar Association.

Robert E. Sullivan, UM law school dean and CLEM director, said the seminar program has been designed to provide comprehensive training for lawyers in aspects of wills, trusts, future interests, conflicts of laws and federal income, and gift and estate taxation useful in estate planning.

Other speakers during the seminar will include James F. Farr, a partner in Haussermann, Davison & Shattuck, Boston, Mass.; William J. Bowe, law professor at the University of Colorado and tax counsel for State Farm Life Insurance Co.; Wendell M. Basye, law professor at the University of Oregon, and Lester R. Rusoff, a UM law professor.

Advance registration for the short course and additional information about the six-day seminar may be obtained through the UM School of Law, Missoula.
