MISSOULA--

A total of 174 students have received University Honors Scholarships at the University of Montana, Missoula, the UM Dean of Students office announced recently.

The award entitles the recipients to a waiver of incidental and registration fees in the amount of \$65 each quarter or \$195 for the 1968-69 academic year.

Students who received the scholarships have earned at least 40 credits (equivalent to a sophomore), without a failure, and have achieved a 3.54 (A-) cumulative grade point.
