72 COMPLETE DRUG SEMINAR AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA, Mont .--

Seventy-two persons, including 13 from other states and one from Canada, have successfully completed the Seminar on the Nature and Effects of Drug Usage, held July 22-26 at the University of Montana.

The seminar was under direction of Dr. Robert L. Van Horne, dean of the UM School of Pharmacy, through a \$3,614.80 grant to the UM under Title I (Community Services) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and matching funds from the University.

Stimulants, depressants and hallucinogens were among the drug types covered during the five-day seminar.

Dr. Van Horne said the seminar was designed mainly for secondary school teachers, although a number of persons from other professions also participated in the classroom sessions.
