DR. TASCHER TO ATTEND
FINLAND CONFERENCE

MISSOULA--

Dr. Harold Tascher, professor of social welfare at the University of Montana, Missoula, will travel to Helsinki, Finland, for the 14th International Conference on Social Welfare August 18-24.

Eight hundred Americans from across the nation will represent the U.S. at the conference, which 2,500 persons from 78 countries are expected to attend.

Dr. Tascher, UM faculty member since 1933, also will attend the Congress of Schools of Social Work, which will precede the Conference and will run from Aug. 14-17. The Congress, which will include a seminar on the economic and social conditions and the social welfare programs of Finland, is sponsored by the International Association of Schools of Social Work (IASSW).

The International Conference is the biennial forum provided by the International Council on Social Welfare, a permanent world organization for individuals and agencies concerned with meeting the social welfare needs of peoples. It is independent, nongovernmental and nonsectarian.

The Council is made up of 48 national committees. Its first meeting was held in Paris in 1928.

Dr. Tascher plans to spend six weeks abroad visiting Norway, Germany and Sweden as well as Finland.

Mrs. Tascher will make the trip with her husband.
