## CAMP GRAND FINALE SCHEDULED FRIDAY

The Montana High School Fine Arts Camp will wind up a two-week session at the University of Montana Friday (Aug. 9) with a performance by the drama workshop, an exhibition by the art section, and a concert by the bands, ballet, orchestra and chorus.

The camp, directed by George D. Lewis of the UM music faculty, drew more than 200 high school students from four states and Alberta, Canada. A limited number of them have been selected to remain on campus an additional week for intensive study in the Montana High School Artists' Camp of brass, woodwinds, strings, piano, percussion, voice or studio art.

The Friday concert by the bands, orchestra, chorus and ballet will be at 8:15 p.m. in the University Theater. Directors of the participating organizations are Avery Glenn, the 52-piece concert band; Dr. Myron Russell, the 51-piece symphonic band; Dr. Joseph Mussulman, the 60-voice chorus; Walter Green, the 57-piece orchestra, and Dana Bunnell, the 29-member ballet group.

Glenn is supervisor of music in the Billings public schools. Dr. Russell is on the faculty of Northern Iowa University, Cedar Falls. Green is principal bassoonist with the San Francisco Symphony. Dr. Mussulman and Mrs. Bunnell are members of the UM faculty.

The program, ranging from the classical to the contemporary, includes works by Lerner and Loewe, Cole Porter, Haydn, Verdi, Beethoven, Sibelius and Faure.

The drama workshop, directed by Roger DeBourg of the UM faculty, will present two one-act plays Friday at 8:15 p.m. in the Masquer Theater. Appearing in "Fumed Oak" by Noel Coward are Richard Grady, Great Falls; Bonnie Brenner, Lewistown; Phyllis Beecher, Billings, and Dale Haines, Missoula.

The cast of "Women at the Crucifixion" by Michel de Ghelderode is made up of Robert McNamee and Mary Ann Dowdall, both of Anaconda; Alan Johnson, Jim Russell and Haines, all of Missoula; Jim Kesl, Holly Axley and Shelley Martens, all of Havre; Jeanni Keller, Great Falls; Janet Adams, Big Timber; Victoria Larson, Harlem; Michelle Stearns, Harlowton; Melody Lanchbury, Poplar; Kay Johnson, Libby, and Sharon Kerr, Charlo.

Work by camp artists, who were directed by Mrs. Lela Autio, will be on display Friday afternoon in the lobby of the Music building and Friday evening in the foyer of the University Theater. The show includes weaving, Raku pottery and jewelry, batik cloth (wax and dye), enameled jewelry, tie-dye pieces (cloth designed by tying string), macrame (knot-tying) and experimental glass slides.

Artists represented are Lisa Autio, Jo Dusterhoff, Rica Garrison and Susan Reinholtz, all of Missoula; Ilene Bridge, Hamilton; Lawrence Bush, Seattle, Wash.; Rahnee Hunt, Great Falls; Mary Jo Sokolich, Anaconda; Anne Wilson, Billings, and Don Young, Troy.

Children 12 and under will be admitted to the Friday performances free. Adults will be charged 50¢. Proceeds will be used for camp scholarships. The art exhibition is free.
