TRIO PERFORMS AT U

Ann Wright of Missoula, violinist; Fred L. Inman of Billings, cellist, and Daniel D. Shelhamer of Bonner, pianist, will present a free public recital Thursday (Aug. 15) at 8:15 p.m. in the University of Montana Recital Hall.

The program consists of Couperin's Pieces en Concert; Mozart's Fantasia, K. 475; Haydn's Duet for Violin and Violoncello; Sarasate's Introduction and Tarentelle, and Brahms' Piano Trio, Op. 87.

Miss Wright attended the University in 1966-67 on a full-fee string quartet scholarship. She was a violin student of Prof. Eugene Andrie. In June 1968 she received a B.A. in French from Carleton College, Northfield, Minn. Her parents are Dr. and Mrs. Philip L. Wright of Missoula.

Shelhamer earned a bachelor of music degree from the UM in 1967 and is currently working for a master's degree. He studies piano with Prof. Rudolph Wendt. He has held a Montana State Music Teachers Assn. scholarship and is past treasurer of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia music honorary. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Conrad Shelhamer, Bonner

Inman, a senior music major, is a cello student of Dr. Florence Reynolds. He holds a full-fee scholarship as a member of the Young Artists' String Quartet. He is past president of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. F. L. Inman of Billings.

The recital is an event of Montana High School Artists Camp, which is in session this week under the auspices of the UM School of Fine Arts.
