NEW HOURS FOR
TWO BUSINESS COURSES
AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA---

Businessmen and others in Missoula and vicinity will have an opportunity to take two graduate courses in business administration during late afternoon and evening hours at the University of Montana this fall.

Dr. Donald Emblen, dean of the UM School of Business Administration, said hours of instruction for the two courses are the result of a number of requests from downtown Missoula businessmen seeking professional improvement.

The two courses and the days and hours of instruction are BA 550--Statistical Methods, Monday and Wednesday, 4-5:30 p.m.; and BA 505--Managerial Accounting, Tuesday and Thursday, 7:30-9 p.m.

First class in Statistical Methods will be Sept. 30 and first class in Managerial Accounting will be Oct. 1. Those wishing to register for either or both courses should do so Sept. 26 or 27, the dates for regular registration on the Missoula campus.

Concerning the new hours for the courses, Dr. Emblen said, "We plan to offer graduate courses in business administration in regular sequences so that it will be possible for some business people to earn their master's degrees in about three years by attending afternoon and evening classes."

The graduate study program is a new phase of the Master of Business Administration (MBA) program launched three years ago on the Missoula campus and last June at Malmstrom Air Force Base, Great Falls. There are 50 graduate students in business administration enrolled on the UM campus and 70 at Malmstrom.

Anyone who holds a baccalaureate degree in any field and who can meet requirements of the UM Graduate School may register for the two graduate courses. Those interested may contact Dr. Emblen or Dr. Jack Kempner, director of graduate studies in the UM School of Business Administration.
