MISSOULA---

Two days in the rustic surroundings of Camp Paxson on Seeley Lake will give 100 incoming University of Montana freshmen a head ^{start} / on college life. The Associated Students of the University (ASUM) are again sponsoring the annual Freshman Camp, Sept. 18-20.

Freshman Camp is planned to acquaint freshmen with various aspects of the University environment. The three-day program includes talks by selected campus professors, student discussion groups, and question and answer periods with upperclassmen and faculty members.

In the informal sessions freshmen become acquainted with campus politics, activities and organizations, and Missoula-University relations. The meetings also give new students a chance to meet professors and future classmates outside of the classroom.

Chartered busses will leave the parking lot in the rear of the UM Lodge at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 18, to transport Camp registrants to Camp Paxson, 60 miles northeast of Missoula. The students will return to campus Friday (Sept. 20) at 11 a.m. in time for sorority rush which begins Friday at 1 p.m.
