TO SPEAK OCT. 18
AT U OF MONTANA

MISSOULA---

Julian Bond, a Georgia representative at the Democratic National Convention who was offered as a vice-presidential nominee, will speak at the University of Montana Oct. 18.

Bond, a Negro, will speak several times during his Missoula visit. His main address is slated for 7:30 p.m. Oct. 18 in the University Theater.

Bond, 28, led a dissident group unsuccessfully against moderates during the Chicago convention in an effort to obtain all of Georgia's 41 delegate votes through the Party's Credentials Committee.

Bond withdrew his name as a potential vice-presidential nominee because he is under the minimum age of 35 required/under the Constitution
to run for office

A no-host luncheon for Bond has been scheduled for noon Oct. 18 in the Territorial Rooms of the UM Lodge. His visit to Missoula is being sponsored by the UM Associated Students and the Campus Christian Council.
