Approximately 350 high school journalists from more than 40 Montana towns will meet at the University of Montana Friday morning (Sept. 27) for the 19th annual conference of the Montana Interscholastic Editorial Association.

The two-day conference is sponsored by the UM School of Journalism and the MIEA, an organization of newspaper and yearbook staffs at 120 Montana high schools.

Gaylord T. Guenin, Sunday editor of the Missoulian, will give the keynote speech Friday at a luncheon in the University Lodge. Twelve sectional meetings will be addressed by high school publications advisers and UM journalism instructors and staff members.

At a general session Saturday, MIEA officers for 1968-69 will be elected, an outstanding Montana publications adviser will receive the journalism school's Gold Key Award and high school yearbook awards will be announced.

Miss Margie Weathermon, representing the MIEA president, Laurel High School, will conduct the general session.
