BUSINESS COURSES
OFFERED EVENING,
NIGHT AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA---

Registration for two courses in business administration, being offered this fall for the first time during late afternoon and evening hours for the convenience of local business people, will be Monday (Sept. 30) and Tuesday (Oct. 1) at the University of Montana.

The courses and days and hours of instruction are BA 550--Statistical Methods, Monday and Wednesday, 4-5:30 p.m., and BA 505--Managerial Accounting, Tuesday and Thursday, 7:30-9 p.m. Registration will be the first class meeting of each course.

According to Dr. Donald Emblen, dean of the UM School of Business Administration, the two graduate courses are the result of several requests from downtown Missoula businessmen who want to improve themselves professionally.

Dr. Emblen said graduate courses in business administration will be offered at UM to enable business people to earn their master's degrees in about three years by attending afternoon and evening classes on the Missoula campus.

Both courses will be taught in the Business Administration Building. Registrants must hold a baccalaureate degree in any field and meet requirements of the UM Graduate School.

The two courses comprise a new phase of the Master of Business Administration (MBA) program launched three years ago on the Missoula campus and last June at Malmstrom Air Force Base, Great Falls.
