SORENSEN, OLSEN  
SPEAK SAT. AT UM

MISSOULA---

Ted Sorensen, former Kennedy aide and speech writer, and Rep. Arnold Olsen will speak Saturday morning (Oct. 19) at a no-host breakfast at the University of Montana.

John D. Meyers of Missoula, Program Council director for Associate Students at UM (ASUM), said the breakfast, which is open to the public, begins at 8 a.m. Saturday in the Territorial Rooms of the Lodge. Those attending should go through the cafeteria line and then take their breakfasts upstairs.

After discussing "The New Politics" on Saturday, Sorensen will answer questions from the audience. During his talk he will refer to the role of young people in today's political world.

Neil Livingstone, Helena, an Olsen aide, said Olsen will discuss "The Olsen Plank" during his campus visit. The talk will be a continuation of remarks the First District congressman made earlier this week in Missoula at the weekly Kiwanis Club meeting. Livingstone said the talk will be highlighted by "an alternative for getting out of Vietnam."

Both Sorensen and Olsen are speaking in Bozeman Friday night. They will arrive by private jet at Johnson-Bell Field, Missoula, about 7:30 a.m. Saturday. Sorensen must leave the University by 9:30 a.m. Saturday for a flight to Missouri, where he speaks during the weekend.

Sorensen will have two dozen copies of his best-selling book "Kennedy" with him in Missoula for anyone who wishes to purchase a copy. He will autograph books sold.

Olsen, a Democrat who will oppose <sup>Dick</sup> Smiley of Bozeman for the Western District congressional seat on Nov. 5, invited Sorensen to Montana for the two speaking engagements.

Sorensen is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of the University of Nebraska. He received his bachelor's degree from the Lincoln, Nebr., institution in 1949 and went on to study law there. He was awarded his law degree from Nebraska in 1951 and was ranked first in his class. Sorensen also was editor in chief of the Nebraska Law Review.

Now editor at large of the Saturday Review, Sorensen also is a partner in the New York law firm of Paul, Weiss, Goldberg, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison. He is a visiting lecturer in public and international affairs at Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School.

Sorensen was a prominent speech writer for the late John F. Kennedy and also was a close adviser to Robert F. Kennedy before the latter was assassinated in June.
