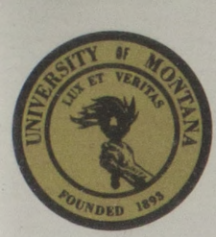

JULIAN BOND
SPEAKS FRIDAY
AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA---

A 9 a.m. press conference and 7:30 p.m. main address will highlight a visit to the University of Montana by Julian Bond on Friday.

Bond, who was to arrive at Johnson-Bell Field by plane from Boston sometime Thursday night, will meet members of the press between 9-11 a.m. Friday at the UM Journalism Building.

His main address will be at 7:30 p.m. in the University Theater, to be followed at 8:30 by a discussion in the Yellowstone Room of the Lodge.

Bond, 28, a member of the Georgia State Legislature, achieved prominence recently at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago. Among other things, Bond's name was submitted as a potential vice-presidential nominee during the convention, but he withdrew his name because he is under the minimum age of 35 required to run for office under the Constitution.

A no-host luncheon for Bond will be at noon Friday in the Territorial Rooms of the Lodge. The main address as well as the luncheon are open to the public.

Bond's visit to the campus is sponsored by the Campus Christian Council and by the Program Council of the Associated Students at UM.

The Rev. David Van Dyck, pastor of the United Campus Christian Fellowship, is coordinating events for Bond's visit.
