### PERRY ORGAN RECITAL IS SCHEDULED TUESDAY

Laurence Perry, chairman of the University of Montana Department of Music, will present a free public organ recital Tuesday (Nov. 5) at 8:15 p.m. in the Recital Hall.

He will be assisted by the Montana String Quartet, comprised of Eugene Andrie and Gerald Doty, violinists, Eugene Weigel, violist, and Florence Reynolds, cellist.

The program consists of Haydn's Concerto in C Major; Mendelssohn's Sonata No. 6, Op. 65 in d minor; Schroeder's Praludium, Kanzone und Rondo fur Violine und Orgel; Honegger's Fugue and Choral, and Creston's Suite, Op. 70.

The recitalist, an associate professor of music, joined the UM faculty in 1959. He holds two degrees from Cornell College and an advanced degree from Indiana University.

He has given recitals throughout the region and has been a choir-master and organist for Missoula churches. He is a member of the American Guild of Organists, the American Musicological Society, Pi Kappa Lambda honorary, and other professional organizations.
