CENTER DIRECTOR  
TO SPEAK AT UM

MISSOULA--

C.T. Vivian, a former member of the board of directors of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, will give two public lectures during a visit to the University of Montana campus Nov. 6 and 7.

Vivian will speak Wednesday (Nov. 6) at 7 p.m. in Room 111 of the UM Liberal Arts Building, and Thursday (Nov. 7) at 10 a.m. in the University Theater. Both lectures are open to the public without charge.

The Negro leader, who is director of fellowships for the Urban Training Center for Christian Mission in Chicago, also will visit UM sociology, psychology and Negro culture classes during his two-day campus visit, which is sponsored by the UM Associated Students Program Council.

Vivian studied at Western Illinois University and received a degree in theology from the American Baptist Theological Seminary. He did graduate work in religious education at Scarritt College for Christian Workers, Nashville, Tenn.

Vivian was on the first freedom bus to enter Jackson, Miss. He served with Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in racial nonviolent movements in several states.
