SECOND COMMENDATION

Mrs. Kathryn E. Page, Missoula, secretary in the Army ROTC Military Science Department at the University of Montana, has received the second official commendation since last spring for performance of duty from the Sixth Army.

Mrs. Page, a native of Defiance, Ohio, has worked in the Army ROTC department since July 1966. She received a commendation recently from Col. Walter A. Pashley Jr., military science chairman on the Missoula campus, on behalf of Maj. Gen. James H. Skeldon, San Francisco, Sixth Army Chief of Staff.
