MISSOULA---

A "State of the University" address by University of Montana President Robert T. Pantzer and a tour of the new \$4.3 million University Center will highlight the fall meeting Saturday (Dec. 14) of the UM Council of 50.

Pantzer will address the 43 council members attending the meeting following registration, which will be at 9 a.m. Saturday in the Territorial Rooms of the Lodge. The University Center tour will be at 11:30 a.m. The Center is the new student union on the Missoula campus. It will be the location of many University activities after it is opened next month.

Also on Saturday's agenda is a discussion of Grizzly basketball activities by Head Coach Bob Cope and Assistant Coach Lou Rocheleau.

Dr. Norman Taylor, UM vice president for research, will discuss UM research developments during an afternoon session and a general discussion involving Council of 50 members and encompassing a wide range of University programs and objectives will precede the 6:15 p.m. dinner for the council members and university officials in the Lodge.

A 12:15 p.m. luncheon also is scheduled for Saturday.

The UM Council of 50 consists of representatives from various professions and virtually all geographical areas of the state. Main purposes of the group are to provide leadership in building the University's educational and public service programs and to assist in maintaining a two-way flow of information between UM and the Montana public.

Thomas J. Collins, UM director of public services and of the UM Foundation, is coordinator of events for the Council of 50, including the group's meeting on Saturday.
