UM, GONZAGA STUDENTS
NAMED TO RHODES
SCHOLAR COMPETITION

MISSOULA---

A University of Montana student and another from Gonzaga University, Spokane, Wash., Wednesday were selected to represent the state of Montana in Rhodes Scholar competition Saturday in Portland, Ore.

Scholarship candidates selected following interviews with 10 students at U M Wednesday were Murdo William McRae, 22, son of Mrs. Lucille McRae, 208½ No. 34th St., Billings, and Terrance D. Callan, 21, son of Dr. and Mrs. T.D. Callan, 821 W. 3rd St., Anaconda.

McRae is a UM senior majoring in history and political science and young Callan is a Gonzaga senior majoring in theology. Both will compete for scholarships in the seven-state district interviews Saturday in Portland, where four Rhodes Scholars will be selected to study at Oxford University in England.

State selection committee members included John H. Toole, a Missoula businessman, chairman; H.G. Merriam and J. Earll Miller, UM professors emeritus; John U. Carlson, an attorney in Aspen, Colo.; Dr. Irving E. Dayton, vice-president for academic affairs at Montana State University, Bozeman, and Dr. Nathan B. Blumberg, a UM professor of journalism who formerly was dean of journalism at UM.

Merriam, Blumberg and Carlson are Rhodes Scholars and Blumberg is secretary of the state committee. Blumberg also will represent the state of Montana on the district selection committee this Saturday.
