ECONOMICS COURSE AVAILABLE TO TEACHERS FROM UM IN JAN.

MISSOULA---

An economics refresher course for Missoula teachers will be offered at the University of Montana beginning January 6, according to John H. Wicks, associate professor of economics and teacher of the course.

The course will be taught under the new Center for Economic Education at the University and will be designed to "promote public understanding of economic matters by strengthening the background of teachers at the secondary and primary level," according to Dr. Wicks.

The course will be taught Monday evenings during Winter quarter at the University between 7 p.m. and 9:30 and is available for University graduate credit at a tuition fee of \$24. It is open to any teacher regardless of background.
