UM JUBILEERS
TO TOUR MILITARY
BASES IN NORTHEAST

MISSOULA, Mont. ---

University of Montana's singing Jubileers have been selected for the second consecutive year to make a USO-National Musical Council tour of U.S. military bases.

Fifteen members of the choral group, including director, Dr. Joseph A. Mussulman, an associate professor of music at UM, will entertain servicemen in the Northeast Command during a tour starting about April 23 and ending May 20, 1969.

The group will perform for troops stationed in Newfoundland, Labrador, Greenland and Iceland. Fifteen is the maximum number permitted to make the tour.

Jubileers are entitled to spend an additional month in educational travel at their own expense, according to Jerome Coray, New York City, director of USO shows.

A year ago the Jubileers, under Dr. Mussulman's direction, toured the Pacific Command under USO-NMC auspices, visiting Korea, Okinawa, Guam, Japan, the Philippines, Hawaii and Iwo Jima.

Dr. Charles W. Bolen, dean of the UM School of Fine Arts, said another fine arts unit from the University -- the company of "The Unsinkable Molly Brown" -- directed by Dr. Firman H. Brown Jr., UM drama chairman, completed a USO tour of the Northeast Command in November. Dr. Brown has also taken a UM company to the Pacific Command for the USO.
