### UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA RECEIVES GRANT FOR OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARDS

MISSOULA---

A grant of \$5,000, including \$3,000 for outstanding teacher awards, has been made to the University of Montana Foundation by the Standard Oil (Indiana) Foundation, Inc.

UM President Robert Pantzer reported the teaching awards will be presented on campus during the spring quarter of this year. He said: "We will be most pleased to participate in this excellent program which should enhance the teaching performance of faculty members at this institution."

The \$2,000 balance of the grant represents an unrestricted award to the University.

Purpose of the grant, according to John H. Lind, executive director of the Standard Oil (Indiana) Foundation, is to recognize and give evidence of the importance placed on superior teaching in the undergraduate schools of the universities and to provide encouragement and incentive for teaching achievement.

The University becomes one of 10 new participants in the program which has been supported for the past three years by the Standard Oil Company of Indiana.
