MEETS JAN. 17-18

MISSOULA---

Members of the University of Montana Foundation will hear reports from UM President Robert T. Pantzer and two other Foundation officials Friday (Jan. 17) during the annual winter Foundation meeting.

Pantzer will give his report at 1:45 p.m. Friday, to be followed by an address by Merritt N. Warden, a Kalispell attorney, who is president-elect of the Foundation.

Robert C. Hendon, Larchmont, N.Y., the outgoing Foundation president, will report to the group's officers during a 10 a.m. meeting Friday. All sessions are scheduled for room 202, Main Hall.

A report on the progress of the Grizzly Circle will be given by Rudy Autio, acting chairman of the art department, and J.A. Parker, UM Physical Plant director, at 2 p.m. Friday.

Grizzly Circle will be located at the present site of the Baby Oval near the UM Lodge. Autio has designed a mold for a huge bronze grizzly bear to be erected in the Grizzly Circle.

The Foundation meeting continues through noon Saturday (Jan. 18). A tour of the new University Center for Foundation members is scheduled for 11 a.m. Friday.

The two-day meeting is coordinated by Thomas J. Collins, Foundation director.

Hendon, who is a UM alumnus, is vice president of Consolidated Freightways Inc. in New York.
