REP THEATER OPENS FEB. 13 WITH TWO AMERICAN PLAYS

MISSOULA--

The Montana Repertory Theater, which enjoyed a thriving first season last winter, opens its second winter season Feb. 13 in Missoula with two offerings, Arthur Miller's "Death of a Salesman" and Oscar Wilde's "The Importance of Being Earnest."

After the initial ten-day Missoula run, the company will depart on a three-week tour of Montana, Idaho, Utah and Canada.

The two plays will be presented alternate nights during the Missoula stay.

Dr. Firman H. Brown Jr., chairman of the UM drama department and director of the theater, is handling both productions. Richard H. James, an associate professor of drama, is the production set designer. Abigail Arnt heads the costume design and execution section. Roger DeBourg, Alan Cook, Barbara Crump, Linda Atkinson and James Baker are the principal professional actors working with the company.
