"Three Days," an oil painting by Paul Havas of Seattle, Wash., has been accepted in "Survey '69," a 10-state invitational show which will open Friday (Feb. 7) in conjunction with the opening of the University Center on the University of Montana campus.

New York painter Elaine de Kooning will select winners of \$1,000 in prizes from the 60 painters invited to show their works.

The exhibition, which will hang in the Center Gallery through Feb. 28, is sponsored by the UM School of Fine Arts and the Montana Institute of the Arts.
