SUNDAY MARKS 3RD DAY
IN UC GRAND OPENING,
76TH ANNIVERSARY OF UM

MISSOULA---

Sunday marks the third day in the celebrations at the University of Montana commemorating the grand opening of the \$4.3-million University Center and the University's 76th anniversary.

No formal tours of the Center will be conducted Sunday but the doors of the new structure will be open for the public to view the many features of the huge student-financed Center.

On display in the art gallery of the second-floor lounge will be "Survey '69", a 10-state invitational art show, to run through Feb. 28.

A no-host banquet for Elaine de Kooning, New York artist and widow of William de Kooning, will be held at 6 p.m. Sunday at the Center. Mrs. de Kooning will select the winners among the 60 artists participating in the show.

Grand opening festivities, which began Friday night, will conclude Monday night with an 8 p.m. concert by pianist Ramsey Lewis and his jazz trio.

Tickets are \$2.50 at the door. Two dollar general admission tickets may be purchased at the Center or downtown at the Cartwheel.
