FOUR PEACE CORPS
RECRUITERS VISIT
U THROUGH FRIDAY

MISSOULA--

A team of four Peace Corps recruiters is visiting the University of Montana through Friday to administer Peace Corps placement tests and visit with UM students who may be interested in joining the corps.

The team, composed of Robert J. Buffin, William L. Carey, and Robert F. Mingori and his wife, Jane, headquarters in San Francisco. They may spend the next several weeks there before being reassigned to continue their recruiting program.

Placement tests are scheduled Wednesday, Thursday and Friday at 2 p.m. in Territorial Room 4 of the Lodge and at 4 p.m. in room 102 of the Liberal Arts Building. The crew has set up a display near the Sidewalk Cafe in the University Center Mall.

In addition to their current recruiting adventure, the four campus visitors have served in the Peace Corps previously in foreign lands.

Buffin served in Venezuela in a community development project, Carey taught elementary and secondary school classes in Bolivia, and Mr. and Mrs. Mingori served in Brazil, teaching and doing social service work.
