JOHN GALBRAITH TO DISCUSS
'NEW INDUSTRIAL STATE'
AT UM ON APRIL 3

MISSOULA, MONT.---

Dr. John Kenneth Galbraith will discuss the "New Industrial State: The Case, Criticism and Consequences" in a public lecture at the University of Montana (UM) April 3.

Dr. Galbraith, an economist, educator and author who won considerable acclaim during the Kennedy administration as U.S. ambassador to India, will lecture at the University here as second speaker in a series launched a year ago under the Mike and Maureen Mansfield Endowment of the UM Foundation.

The series, entitled the Mansfield Lectures on International Relations, was established as a permanent program to bring prominent international authorities to the Missoula campus to speak on foreign affairs.

The series, which is in honor of Mansfield's 25 years of congressional service and the University's 75th anniversary a year ago, is being supported with \$114,000 in UM Foundation funds invested in income-producing securities.

Dr. Galbraith's main lecture is slated for 8 p.m. April 3 in the Five Valleys Room of the new University Center.

Sen. Mansfield launched the lecture series himself a year ago at the University when he discussed "China: Retrospect and Prospect."

Besides the main lecture on April 3, Dr. Galbraith also has scheduled several other sessions during his two-day visit to the Missoula campus April 3-4.

Other meetings on the agenda include:

April 3--Discussion session with students and faculty in economics, history and political science, 2:30-4 p.m., University Center Gold Oak Room.

April 4--Discussion with law students and faculty, 10-11:30 a.m., Law School Building; question-and-answer session with students and general public, 2 p.m., Five Valleys Room of University Center.

Dr. Galbraith, who now is an economics professor at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., is a native of Ontario, Canada. He has lived in the U.S. since 1931 and holds a doctorate in economics from the University of California besides Doctor of Laws degrees from more than half dozen other American universities and three in Canada. He holds a Doctor of Letters from the Universities of Annamalai and of Mysore in India.

A book written by Dr. Galbraith entitled "The New Industrial State" has been described as his most important book. It knits the great changes of the past 50 years into a complete and consistent view of modern industrial society.

Other books he has written include "The Great Crash, 1929," "The Affluent Society," "Economic Development" and "The Scotch."
