LOCAL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE
CONTRIBUTES \$500 TO UM
FOR S&H LECTURE SERIES

MISSOULA---

The Missoula Chamber of Commerce has contributed \$500 to the University of Montana School of Business Administration for the 1968-69 Sperry and Hutchinson Co. Lectureship Program.

The \$500 contribution from the chamber and another grant of \$2,000 from the S & H Co. Foundation is enabling the UM School of Business Administration to conduct a series of five lectures on campus dealing with the practice of business management and relationship of business to science.

Commenting on the \$500 grant to UM, Dr. C.P. Brooke, M.D., president of the Missoula Chamber of Commerce, said, "The business community of Missoula profits greatly by being close to and cooperative with the University School of Business Administration."

Dr. George J. Brabb, professor of business administration and management at UM, said the \$500 grant from the Chamber of Commerce has been a valuable contribution to the lecture program because that amount is needed to meet expenses in bringing speakers to campus.

Dr. Brabb has been campus coordinator for the lecture series at the University.

The S & H Foundation Lectureship Program, established in 1960 as part of the S & H Co.'s program of aid to education, has awarded 283 grants to more than 200 colleges and universities since 1960.
