MRI SENIOR ADVISOR
SPEAKS WED. AT UM
IN S & H SERIES

MISSOULA---

Howard Gadberry, senior advisor for technology at the Midwest Research Institute (MRI), Kansas City, Mo., will be guest lecturer Wednesday (April 9) at the University of Montana here in a continuing series supported by the S & H Foundation, sponsored by the Sperry and Hutchinson Co. with further support from the Missoula Chamber of Commerce.

Gadberry will present the lecture entitled "Science, Business and Regional Resource Development" at 8 p.m. Wednesday in the UM Music Recital Hall, replacing Bruce Macy, MRI's principal economist, ^{who} was to give the lecture but will be unable to because of illness.

The lecture is open to the public without charge and a reception for Gadberry follows his speech.

Gadberry will be the fourth lecturer to visit UM during the current academic year under a \$2,000 grant from the S & H Foundation Inc. and an additional sum of \$500 from the local Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. George J. Brabb, UM professor of business administration and lecture series coordinator, said, "This lecture and the final lecture May 7 are intended to present the benefits and problems associated with the full economic utilization of natural and human resources in Montana."

In the May 7 lecture, Dr. Alfred Etter, an ecologist with the Defenders of Wild Life, Aspen, Colo., will discuss "Dilemmas of Development."
