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# Greek Social History

## *Individual, Family, and Civic Life in Ancient Greece*

This course examines several aspects of personal, social, and political life of classical times in Greece. Readings are primarily in various ancient authors, with some additional modern material to be considered in the light of these. Through lecture and some discussion we will try to get to know the ancient Greeks; the coursework will call upon students' powers not only of careful and critical listening and reading, but also of written and possibly oral discourse. A short preliminary draft preparatory to a more ambitious final paper due toward the end of the term, a midterm and a final exam, and various other indications of genuine engagement in the course will constitute the bases for evaluation.
