UM LAW PROFESSOR
ELECTED TO COMMISSION

MISSOULA---

Dr. Gardner Cromwell, professor of law at the University of Montana, was elected to the Permanent Judicial Commission of the General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church USA, at a meeting last week in San Antonio, Texas.

Highest judicial body within the Presbyterian church, the Permanent Commission is delegated the responsibility of reviewing all legal procedures appealed to the General Assembly and making the necessary recommendations for action.

Functioning in many respects like the Supreme Court, the 15-man commission is a national advisory council composed of eight ministers and seven ruling elders.

Dr. Cromwell is an elder in the First Presbyterian Church of Missoula. He and his family live at 440 East Beckwith Ave.
