JUBILEERS TO RETURN JUNE 6 FROM USO TOUR, EUROPEAN VISIT

MISSOULA ---

Most of the Universtiy of Montana's singing Jubileers return home Friday (June 6) after an extended USO tour of military bases in the Northeast Command and a visit to Europe.

The Jubileers, led by Dr. Joseph A. Mussulman, associate professor of music at UM, left April 19 on the tour and spent a month entertaining servicemen before beginning a tour of London, Paris, Florence and Vienna May 19.

The group is scheduled to arrive at Johnson-Bell Field at 5:53 p.m. Friday on Northwest Airlines'Flight 109.

Returning Jubileers include Alan H. Taylor, Don MacDonald and Michael R. Swisher, Missoula; Nancy Johnson, Conrad; Jeannine Marie Morrow, Baker; Donna Lenore Morey, Butte; Gregory W. Devlin, Polson; Robert E. Quist, Cut Bank; ArLynn V. Toavs, Wolf Point; Nancy Lee Irle, Glasgow, and Pamela South, Salmon, Idaho.

Randy Lee Harrison, <u>Billings</u>, another Jubileer member who toured the military bases but did not make the European portion of the trip, said he hitchhiked from New York City to Billings beginning May 19 so he would be able to keep an employment engagement with the <u>Coeur d'Alene</u>, <u>Idaho</u>, Summer Theater.

Another Jubileer, Susan Teresa Volkel of Missoula, stayed in Paris to study.

Harrison said the Jubileer performances scheduled for Keflavik Naval Installation, Iceland, were cancelled due to military air drills. The University group did perform at Thule and Sondrestrom Air Force Bases, Greenland; Goose Air Force Base, Labrador, and Argentia Naval Station, Newfoundland.

The Montana group also entertained UM alumni in New York City on May 18 at a restaurant following the appearance of a four-man University team on the G.E. College Bowl program on the NBC Television Network.
