UM TO HOST THIRD ANNUAL
YOUTH LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

MISSOULA--

Montana's third annual Youth Leadership Conference will convene June 20-22 at the University of Montana.

Registration for the three-day program will be between 1-4 p.m. June 20 on the Missoula campus.

All sessions will be held in the University Center.

The event, for young men and women between 16-20, is sponsored by the Montana Federation of Business and Professional Women. Mrs. Dallas J. Reed, Missoula, is conference coordinator.

Robert Holding, Libby, public relations director for the St. Regis Paper Co., will be the keynote speaker. He is scheduled to speak at the banquet at 7 p.m. June 20 in the Montana Rooms of the University Center.

Norris E. Johnson, executive vice-president of the Missoula Chamber of Commerce, will be the guest speaker at breakfast June 21 at 8:30 a.m.

At the luncheon session June 21 several guest speakers will discuss topics pertaining to the youth of today--boy-girl social relations, drug abuses and law enforcement.

Doug Chase, public relations officer for the Missoula Police Department, will speak on "Law Enforcement and Crime Prevention." Other speakers will include Dr. F.D. Anderson, who is a Missoula physician, and a law enforcement officer from West Yellowstone.
