HSTR 291 Honors College Seminar for Terrorism in the Modern World (HSTR 272E)

Description of the Course

Students in the seminar will meet every Friday in DHC 117 from 2:00 to 2:50 with Professor Drake. They will discuss the lectures, readings, and/or films for that week in HSTR 272E. President's Lecture Series presentations, when germane to the course, will also be discussed in the seminar. Students will write one five-page review of a book about terrorism not on the required reading list for HSTR 272E. The review, which will be worth fifty per cent of the semester grade, will be due in class on Friday, 14 April. The other fifty per cent of the semester grade will be based on seminar participation. The goal of the course is to provide a stimulating intellectual seminar environment for highly motivated students in which they can acquire an understanding of the historical forces responsible for the scourge of terrorism in the modern world. The discussion materials for our weekly meetings will follow the HSTR 272E syllabus.
