MUSICAL GROUP, "THE YOUNGTIMERS," TO
ENTERTAIN AT U OF MONTANA, JULY 10

MISSOULA--

"The Youngtimers," a group of singing collegians from Utah State University, Logan, will perform at the University of Montana, July 10.

The musical company consists of 22 singers, dancers and instrumentalists. Members of the group range in age from 18 to 26 years. Each of The Youngtimers is a full-time student.

They will perform once in Missoula at the University Center Ballroom. General Admission is \$1, students 50¢ and children under 12 will be admitted free. Curtain time is 8:15 p.m. Tickets are available at the University Center Information Desk, The Cartwheel and the UM Music School office. Reservations are not necessary.

Within four years, the singing collegians have risen from total obscurity to a position of national prominence and acclaim. They have been compared to such groups as "The Young Americans," "The Doodletown Pipers" and "The Kids Next Door."

Richard Watkins is director and arranger, and Mrs. Jackie Fullmer is choreographer. Both are USU staff members.

"The Youngtimers" repertoire ranges from old-time favorites to modern rock hits. Their appearance will feature hit tunes including "Yellow Balloon," "Born Free," and "Up, up and Away," and nearly two dozen other musical favorites in vocal and instrumental arrangements.
