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University of Montana to conduct stuttering workshop July 31-August 2

A workshop in stuttering is scheduled July 31-Aug. 2 at the University of Montana to explore in open, free discussion the current conflicts in stuttering theory and therapy.

University seniors and graduates in speech pathology and psychology and practicing speech pathologists and psychologists are invited to attend the sessions.

Workshop participants will be limited to 30.

Two visiting distinguished professors will critically evaluate current procedures and techniques to improve assistance given to stutterers in the Missoula area.

Both professors--Drs. Charles Van Riper and Albert Murphy--are internationally recognized specialists in the field of stuttering and Fellows in the American Speech and Hearing Assn.

Dr. Van Riper is a distinguished professor at Western Michigan University. Dr. Murphy is professor and director of the Psycho-Educational Clinic at Boston University.

Participants not enrolled in summer session will be charged a \$10 fee. No credit will be given for the workshop. Dr. Richard M. Boehmler, workshop director and a professor in the UM speech pathology and audiology department, said the course is offered to the specialists, "simply for their own benefit."

Dr. Boehmler said "the workshop will get off the abstract level" and work with actual cases to better understand possible solutions to the patient's problems.

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
